1st amendment	Guarantees and protects the freedom of/to: Religion Assembly Press Petition Speech Remember: RAPPS
2nd Amendment	Right to keep and bear arms
3rd amendment	Prohibits the gov't from forcing people to house and feed soldiers in their homes
4th amendment	Protects citizens from unreasonable searches and seizures
5th amendment	Guarantees that a person accused of a crime will not be denied the right to life, liberty, and property without due process of law Self incrimination Protection against double jeopardy Indictment by a grand jury Eminent Domain Due process of law Remember: SPIED
6th amendment	The right of an accused person in criminal cases to: Lawyer Impartial jury Nature of the charges Know the witness Speedy public trial Remember: LINKS
7th amendment	Guarantees the right to a trial by jury in civil cases
8th amendment	Protects you from excessive bail and cruel and unusual punishment
9th amendment	We have rights beyond those mentioned in the constitution
10th amendment	Powers not specifically give to the federal gov't are give the to the states or the people
